How you can help

When mowing, deliberately leave small areas unmown (even over the winter!). These "islands" serve as retreats and preserve diversity.

Give nature some space

- Mow less often, leaving at least 8 cm of grass
- Use regional seeds
- Make your garden natural
- Avoid using fertilizers and pesticides
- Incorporate green facades and roofs
- Provide nesting boxes. Birds, insects, and bats will thank you!



The Initiative was founded in the year of biodiversity 2010 by students and employees of the University of Tübingen, who are committed to a sustainable and extensive maintenance concept for public parks and green areas in the city of Tübingen.

Together with the city administration and the Baden-Württemberg Office for Property and Building, the Initiative assesses and adjusts any measures to be carried out on a regular basis in terms of species friendliness and practicability. Over time, we have developed concepts that show how even small areas can be transformed into species-rich "colorful meadows", often through simple measures.

Goals and Actions



If you look closely, you'll notice: life is everywhere!

In recent years, the number of plant and animal species in Germany has decreased significantly. Many species are endangered, mainly because of the disappearance of their habitats. We want to do something about it!

Attractive habitats need to be created not only in designated nature reserves, but also in areas that are more heavily used by people. Here, urban areas come into focus as alternative habitats because biodiversity can also be promoted in and around cities.

If little-used areas are mowed less often, many plants, insects, and birds can settle there again. A wildflower meadow with butterflies and numerous buzzing wild bees is also more attractive and interesting for us humans than a monotonous lawn.



Last, but not least, the "Colorful Meadows" enable children to experience and discover the variety of nature with all their senses.

What we wish to achieve

- Joint promotion of biodiversity in the urban area of Tübingen
- Optimization of nature conservation and accompaniment of the maintenance of public green spaces
- Creation and introduction of an extensive mowing concept for public green spaces
- Encouragement of other public institutions, companies, and individuals to carry out similar projects

...and what we are doing about it

- Introducing an extensive mowing concept (mowing once or twice a year) currently on 47 model meadows (15 ha) in the city of Tübingen
- Informing our fellow citizens
- Making a scientific inventory of the flora and fauna in public green areas
